I pose the question why fishing, and fly fishing in particular, is so powerless in comparison with almost all other sports. It appears to be politically, socially, and seemingly financially assessed by Sports England, as largely insignificant.

Liz Nicholl, chief executive of UK Sport, said 'To continue funding sports where the evidence is telling us they cannot win a (Olympic) medal by 2020 would be a high risk strategy that compromises opportunities elsewhere'.

All the big hitters in the sports world are based on Competition. This is what Sports England and UK Sport understand. The vast majority of anglers, and in particular fly fishers are opposed to competition. So we shall continue to stroll to insignificance

Now of course it is not competition that is the factor, it is the political and organisational structure that is required to manage competition AT EVERY LEVEL.

It is the fact that everyone who is a member of a team is intimately dependant on everyone else, from their team mate to the Club Organisers, who are themselves dependant on local and national management bodies. Competition requires cooperation and collectivity. Angling abhors these. Anglers are isolationists. That is inherent in the activity. **This is**

not the best characteristic to achieve political influence.

What can we do? Well the first thing has been done for us! We have been forced to have a single management body – The Angling Trust. Like the F.A. or the M.C.C. or the L.T.A. and all other sports we are represented by one Governing Body. It is now up to the Angling Trust! Many fly fishers do not like it but **IT IS THE ONLY GAME IN TOWN.** Use it or lose it!

To achieve parity with other sports the A.T. needs to do three things. The first will be difficult, the second very difficult and the third nearly impossible.

The first is for the Angling Trust to become the only nationally recognised validating body for angling coaches. In every other sport I can think of the National Body set the curriculum, manages the courses and examines and certifies coaches. The coaching awards keep the game honest. **This is the basis of their influence.** Don't subtlet this to other organisations. There should only be one fly fishing coaching organisation **The Angling Trust Game Anglers Instructors** – and the qualification an ATGAI certificate (And an ATCAI and ATSAI certification)

The second is, both in theory and practice, to become the governing body for all angling competitions. It could at least

I suppose what I am saying is that the Angling Trust needs to be, not in theory, but in practice the Governing Body. **This requires universal membership.** We are told there are more anglers than participants in any other sport. If every angler was a member - **then see how persuasive** the Angling Trust could be.

This AMFC group match fielded 30 anglers at Pitsford Water.

On inspection at the jetty, and let's be honest we all have a glance at what people are setting up, you could see a range of lines from Intermediate to Midge Tip. Blobs, Nymphs and Booby's were all on parade. Everyone was targeting the top few feet – inches.

Rain and a light mist hung in the air for the first 30minutes of the match as the flotilla of boats seemed all to be going to the same location “the Dam”.

13 of the 15 boats lined up with the dam wall, drifting out towards the boils buoy line.

Soldier Palmers, Fish Hawks and Rutland had put rods on the water the day before and it was clear to see that fish were not found in great numbers anywhere else but this location.

Rods started to bend in turn but it was not a turkey shoot in any fashion. You could say that the round was going to be won and lost in area of approx 100 x 100m.



It appeared that a small pod of fish was moving around the dam area probably being displaced by all our activity in the boats.

Unlike practice day when the retrieve was relatively quick the fish still seemed high in the water but preferred a slow and steady figure of eight before locking up. As the day slowed up for 14 boats, it was a different story for boat 24. To all our frustration this boat seemed to find the fish One angler was heard to say to his boat partner a number of times “bl**dy hell, we have just drifted there for nothing”, just as Graham Pearson pulled another rainbow out of the water.

not gone any deeper but the fishing became harder to catch apart for boat 24 of course. Graham Pearson managed to get his 8th fish at 1315 The fish fell to a midge tip, nymphs and an orange FAB.

Group Two - Round Four achieve 7.1 Average

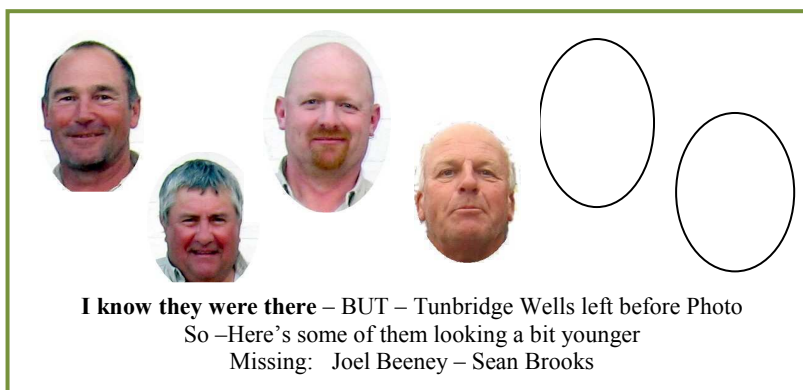
The weather was perfect for the Group Two Match on Eyebrook. There was a light wind from the West with only intermittent sunny periods until the late afternoon.

Improved weather conditions with much lighter winds meant that expectations of many early finishers was high.

The two earliest finishers were Andrew Green (Bewl 'A') and Sean Brooks (Tunbridge Wells) who both had 6lbs of Timer Bonus AND ALSO each had an identical weight of fish at 13lbs 4oz. They shared Best Bag.

At the start EVERY boat just left the harbour and started fishing along the Dam Wall. A number of boats motored to the eastern end of the dam – others started just outside the harbour.

There was no doubt that there were a lot of fish in this area, but after 2.00pm they became much more difficult. Nevertheless most boats stayed in the area. This was a pity because there were fish everywhere but the top of Stoke Dry, which was badly coloured.



Indeed the President and Secretary fished Mucky Bay and on every drift of about 100 yards out from the bank moved three or four fish to dries. Orange Hoppers out fishing all other patterns.

For the competitors a variety of methods seemed to work and some anglers stuck to dries all day; orange hoppers and black or red cul's being the types the fish seemed to prefer. For others, and particularly those that caught quickly, the usual combination of tequila boobies and blobs interspersed with diawl bachs fished steadily on Di3, Fast Glass or midge tip did the business.

On the day there were plenty of limits and a rod average of over seven, although it has to

be said there were no larger fish caught and an eight fish bag weighed between 12lb and 14lb. was hardly memorable.

Statistically only Bewl 'A' and Tunbridge Wells can now win the Group. There will be no home advantage with the Autumn Match now transferred to Bewl.

One Angler bucks the trend and claims limit and time bonus On Difficult Rutland where average is only 2.2

With all three groups fishing on the same day at Pitsford – Eyebrook and Rutland, it was interesting to see how they would compare.

The weather was almost identical at the three reservoirs. It was almost perfect for fly fishing with a light breeze and cloud until the middle of the afternoon and not too warm.

Rutland proved by far the more difficult. Only one angler caught a limit and the average was just 2.2.

Nigel Sudborough of Grey Lags was the only angler to catch a limit and his time bonus was crucial in their win by the tiniest of margins over Soldier Palmers 'B'.



Interestingly Nigel fished a medium sinker with a black booby on the point and cormorants. He finished just before 4.00pm. His boat partner using the same caught only one. Was there some subtle variation in depth – fly design – retrieve etc. or was it just good and bad luck?

All the boats fished along the South Shore. The majority from the Church all the way down to Fantasy Island. I believe one boat fished East

Creek and other boats visited it occasionally. At the end all the boats (*Including four that were Late Back - Two of them by nearly 15 minutes*) came from the Normanton Shore.

Each team had at least one blank. If you have not caught by about 4.30pm you sort of - give up. But this may not be the right thing to do.

Even though they had two fewer fish than Soldier Palmers, Grey Lags beat them by the tiny margin of 2.75 ounces.

With two rounds to go it is tight at the top with Grey Lags and Bewl 'B' both on nineteen points – and the Autumn Match will now be fished on Bewl.
